



How do I volunteer as a Global Citizen?

The Global Citizenship Program (GCP) offers Deakin University students the opportunity to broaden their horizon by volunteering in international community projects.

Each volunteer project aims to combine a healthy balance of work and recreation. Your involvement will help provide much needed support to developing communities and while projects will be challenging, they offer life-changing rewards. In return for your efforts, you will have the opportunity to explore the area, interact with locals and be immersed in their culture.

Project costs are kept to a minimum but please note that flights and associated travel costs are additional.

Volunteers can choose from a variety of destinations. These projects normally run for two-three weeks in either the inter-trimester break or at the end of Trimester 2. Feel free to further explore your chosen country before or after the volunteer program, at your own expense.

The GCP Volunteering program is worth 20 points towards the GCP award. To become a GCP award recipient you must earn 100 points of international experience. The award will instil in you the values of global citizenship and will communicate your international experience and associated competencies to future employers.

Volunteering programs

The destinations are as varied and exciting as the projects. The following is an example of what the Global Citizenship Volunteering program offers:

Fiji

This project involves the construction and refurbishment of preschools on the beautiful island of Taveuni.

picturesque Spiti Valley, this program is a construction based ecotourism

project.

Sri Lanka Volunteers are involved in a variety of

projects focused on community and education in underprivileged schools in the eastern province of Sri Lanka.

Peru Projects in local schools and

communities in the Sacred Valley, range from decorating and refurbishing, to leading sports or

artistic activities.

Malawi Participate in a school based

project that provides environmental education in a community within the African township of Senga Bay, on the

shores of Lake Malawi.



Credit for volunteering?

You may be eligible to enrol in MIS291 'Community Based Volunteering' as a level 2 elective unit and earn credit towards your degree. For more information see www.deakin.edu.au/buslaw/wil/cbv.php.

Domestic students undertaking the MIS291 unit may be eligible to apply for an OS-Help Loan to help fund their participation in the program. The purpose of OS-Help is to assist students with a range of expenses such as airfares and accommodation. Please note OS-Help Loans can take up to four weeks to process and payment deadlines must be met regardless of the status of your loan.
